

Joint Sessions: 8 lectures with colleagues from related disciplines and international Heart Failure Societies highlighting different perspectives of clinical management.

 **French Language Sessions:** The French speaking sessions, dedicated to nurses and GPs, are designed to improve the knowledge on the diagnosis, treatment and comprehensive care of heart failure. Through clinical case presentations, attendees will learn the essential take home messages from the ESC Guidelines.


Transport


Bus






